Kate called the meeting to order at 8:36am.

## Principal's Update - Mark Rubin-Toles

- 8th Graders have had their first of four career chats. Students found out what a career as an Engineer and 911 Dispatcher would be like. If you or someone that would be willing to talk with students about a career please let us know. The hope is to have different industries and areas of services represented.
- The 50th day of school will be on October 23. The school is planning to celebrate on this day to help mark their 50th year. Students are encouraged to dress from the 50's. There will also be a 50 acts of kindness challenge.
- Students artwork is being displayed at Tohono Chul during their Chilies, Chocolate and Day of the Dead Festival.
- Parent Teacher Conferences are coming up during our two half-days. Parents can sign-up and choose
  a slot that works for them. Both online and in-person options are available. These conferences are
  designed to be problem based conferences so all students are not expected to need one and parents
  should not feel obligated to sign-up. This year conferences are 15 minutes to allow for more time.
   Parents were reminded that they are always able to meet with their child's teacher anytime throughout
  the year. The sign-up for conferences is in the Picks of the Week.

## **Executive Reports**

## President - Kate Spaulding

 Kate shared that she has been working to setup the online meeting using school equipment but feels the Owl has been the best and easiest solution. For today's meeting we are using the Owl provided by Kate.

## • Treasurer - Jeannette Hartshorne

- Jeannette reported that we are at \$22,075.15 in revenue. Since last month we have received revenue from Bashas cards, our first color run sponsorship and the Chipotle fundraiser which raised \$750. Panther Pride is currently at 75%. Expenses are at \$11,244.60, which has covered teacher reimbursements, department support and grants.
- Jeannette also shared that she filed our appropriations report this month and that our financials are good.

## • VP Fundraising - Laura Logue

Laura also acknowledged having Panther Pride now at 75% is great. There are plans for a \$50 on the 50th day of school campaign.

## Grants - Barbie Chang

Barbie presented two grants at the meeting.

- The OG Health Office is requesting \$180 to purchase a wheelchair. The school would like a wheelchair that is able to safely transport students from the field. The current wheelchair is meant for in home use and is not stable when being used outside. The wheelchair being purchased would have larger wheels and provide increased stability for use outside on gravel and grass surfaces.
  - **Motion:** To approve a grant for \$180 to purchase a wheelchair for the health office. Second received. **Approved.**
- The grant for virtual meeting technology presented at our last FFO meeting is being revisited. At the last meeting there were initially some concerns about cost and the FFO wanted to look at other possible options.
  - Kate reported that using the equipment at the school has not worked well and comes with many challenges. Also, there have not been any additional recommendations for other technology options.
  - The Meeting Owl has worked well and our hybrid FFO meetings have benefited from it's tracking capability, 360 viewing and microphone/speaker capabilities.
  - This technology can easily be used and would allow us to continue to provide a remote option for families who can not attend FFO meetings in person. It would be compatible with the school's chromebooks, an ipad and google meet.
  - **Motion:** to approve the \$1,400 technology grant to purchase a Meeting Owl, expansion mic, carry case, and extension cord. Second received. **Approved.**
